To White America,

To those of you who feel inclined to comment on the actions and aspirations of the Black community, I encourage you to maintain that same energy as we embark on a transformative journey toward economic independence. We are actively engaged in purchasing properties, establishing businesses, and ultimately ceasing our financial reliance on existing systems that do not serve us. We do not seek your approval or your partnerships; we require the space to operate without interference.

Our goal is to achieve a fully self-sustaining economy. While your structures have historically benefitted some, we have consciously decided to cultivate our own institutions and networks. We will draw inspiration from successful, organized communities around the world and are building alliances with sovereign nations and members of the African diaspora. We are determined to forge a future unburdened by economic dependence on white-dominated businesses or political entities.

This movement is a deliberate and strategic plan, not a mere reaction. Non-racist individuals among you are encouraged to acknowledge our humanity and support our cause. However, you must understand that our solidarity will be unwavering. I have devoted nearly two decades to this endeavor, acquiring certifications and establishing connections with over 1,000 manufacturers prepared to support our vision. We will uplift our communities and secure our economic future by employing our own people.

As we unify, embracing individuals of African descent from across the globe—including from Latin America and Muslim-majority countries—we will remain steadfast against those who underestimate our resolve. This is not a jest; it is a serious commitment to reshaping our economic landscape. We will redirect our purchasing power and create a robust, self-sufficient ecosystem that outmatches existing markets in quality, value, and sustainability.

In preparation for potential challenges, we are strategically positioned and ready. Our collective diversity is our strength, and together, we represent a formidable force. For those who view this ambition as a threat or a joke, I urge you to reconsider. The name EyeHeru LLC will stand as a testament to our determination and success.

Furthermore, I wish to address the broader issues of social injustice and economic disparity. If I am to be silenced or perish, understand this: our plan remains intact and our resolve unyielding. When I am gone, the stewardship of this mission will belong to leaders within our community, such as the Nation of Islam, Hebrew Israelites, and others who share our vision. We will mobilize all groups—reforming gangs, uniting militias, and creating a powerful coalition focused on empowerment, economic development, and community upliftment.

We aim to address the needs of our veterans, ensuring that healthcare, mental health support, and sustainable living conditions are no longer afterthoughts but priorities. Instead of defunding the police, we will advocate for reform and proper funding, recognizing their role as protectors of the community while ensuring they understand who stands with them.

White America, you claim to be patriotic, yet the presence of homelessness and suffering within your cities reveals a systemic failure. Ask yourselves: Why do homeless white veterans individuals seek help in Black communities? Why is homelessness pervasive despite your historical political and financial power? The condition of our communities and the challenges faced by veterans must be addressed. If you are truly committed to this nation, then act with compassion and solidarity rather than hostility.

The question remains: How long can you survive by existing within a structure built on exclusion and racism? Without resorting to violence and bloodshed you cannot beat us the only way you can stop us is with a gun because you're too weak financially and mentally to Beat It fairly Black People Unite towards Massacre that is an inferiority complex in the White America belief system but we are more organized than the Ku Klux Klan the police department the fire department any other organization we are more advanced and unified now you're starting to see it
