Coach Dave,

As I was reading your message just now, I was struck with the truth of being given a "Commission".

Those of us who served our time in uniform, understand exactly what is missing. We also know that if a person leaves the service they are still subject to recall...unless...as in the case of Officers...they have resigned their "Commission". I don't know of anyone who has done that...except for when General Patton told everyone he was going to resign his commission...so he could run for President...and that did not turn out well for him.

However, I do not know of anyone who willingly said they were no longer bound by their oath..."to preserve, protect and defend the Constitution of the united States of America against all enemies both foreign and DOMESTIC".

The main problem is this. People say they are in the Army of God and will go to war with satan when required...but, very few of those glad handers have ever been to BASIC TRAINING.

None of them were required to put their regular street clothes in a box and send them home and then were issued the only clothing they could wear during Basic Training. No one looked different or "special". Then the first thing they are instructed in is learning how to march and march together. Unity is established immediately. A Platoon Guide and Squad Leaders are picked at random and replaced immediately for lack of enthusiasm.

They are all trained in the same subjects...at the same time and tested for their proficiency so the Army can decide if they want to keep them or not.

At the end of 8 -10 weeks...they will function like a well oiled machine and do what they are told to do without the slightest hesitation and everyone will instantly understand what they are supposed to do...by habit...when the Drill Sergeant calls out a command. And...they can do it for the rest of their lives if called to.

Churches today...may or may not have an altar call and look for volunteers. Sign em up and tell them..."Everything will be fine from now on". What a bunch of horse manure that is... The reality is the enemy will know who you are now...because you even have a name tag. Those same churches and their denominational "advisors" who don't know squat...in general...issue some orders to make "converts" so the number grow and they can get a few more dollars... My Grandson Chase is in training to be a missionary. He leaves for Ghana in September. I keep telling him there are more than enough people in the neighborhood to keep him busy forever. But, he'll be fine.

I told a local pastor that the only reason he sends people to foreign countries to be missionaries is because he is afraid to send them next door. He got the message...I got the boot.
